

The Pastors' Ponderings

As we turn the pages of the calendar to a new year and this first newsletter of that new year the song "I Am the Light of the World," which is one of our favorites, comes to mind. The song was written by Jim Strathdee and is based on a poem by Howard Thurman. Thurman, a writer, theologian, teacher, and civil rights leader, was born in 1899 and was

raised by his grandmother who was a former slave.

The beginning of the song reminds us of the proclamation in John's Gospel that Jesus is the Light of the World:

"I am the light of the world! You people come and follow me!"

If you follow and love you'll learn the mystery

of what you were meant to do and be."

The first stanza then reminds us of the transition from the celebrating of Christmas to the *living* and *doing* of Christmas:

"When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone,

When the sages and the shepherds have found their way home,

the work of Christmas is begun..."

That work, as described by the poem-song, includes many tasks:

"to heal the broken soul with love, to feed the hungry children...

to free the prisoner from all chains, to make the powerful care,

to rebuild the nations with strength of good will,

to see all God's children everywhere...

to bring hope to every task you do...."

There is more to the song and surely many more stanzas could be

added with what it means to begin and continue the work of Christmas.

We may put the ornaments and decorations of Christmas in a box not long after December 25, but the challenge for us as followers of the Christ is to let the Christ-Spirit live in and through us throughout the coming year so Christ's mission of love might ever more become a

reality in this world. As Alan J. Roxburgh & M. Scott Boren have said in one of their books:

"God is up to something in the world that is bigger than the church even though the church is called to be sign, witness, and foretaste

of God's purposes in the world.

The Spirit is calling the church on a journey outside of itself....

the church is to be God's hands and feet in accomplishing

God's mission."

Each one of us has the opportunity to participate in the fullness of the meaning of Christmas in the coming year by being involved in the working out God's purposes here and in the world beyond!

As you live and do Christmas may you know many and abundant blessings!

All our preschoolers exchanged Christmas gifts, played Christmas games and enjoyed yummy treats!


