Pastor's Ponderings February 2023

We are in the midst of the Epiphany Season. We "bask" in the light of God that was revealed to the world on Christmas day. We celebrate the light as we remember the arrival of the Magi, the giving of gifts and solemn worship of the Christ Child by the "wisemen" from the East.

The month of February holds the beginning of Lent. Ash Wednesday is on February 22. On that day we begin the season of self examination and penitence. Merriam-Webster Dictionary defines *penitent* as feeling or expressing humble or regretful pain or sorrow for sins or offenses. *Penitence* is, the quality or state of being *penitent*.

On Ash Wednesday we receive the ashes as an expression of our repentance. It is an act of penitence. The season of Lent gives us the opportunity to search out of our experiences...out of our actions...out of our behaviors... those times when we have gone against the will of God. If sin is the separation between us and God, then there are sins of commission and omission in each of our lives. It is hard enough for us to follow God's commandments in all that personally touches our lives, yet we must realize that we are also complicit in the sins of the world.


While the church did not pull the triggers of the guns used in the more than 40 mass shootings that have already occurred in 2023, our unwillingness to participate in meaningful dialog around reasonable gun laws makes us complicit. While the did not bully the young person who committed suicide because they were bullied because of their physical appearance, their learning disability or their struggles with sexual orientation, we are complicit when we do not advocate against such activity in our schools and step up when we see it in our neighborhoods.

I write these words not to depress or brow-beat, but for two reasons. The first is to remind us of the many responsibilities we have as Christians who follow a Christ who gave us two great commandments: Love God and Love your Neighbor.

Secondly, to lift up a God of grace and mercy who forgives the sins of all who confess with truly repentant hearts. Our acts of penitence should not be reserved just for the season of Lent, but every day. God loves us for the sinners we are. God wants us to unburden ourselves and to move forward following in the footsteps of Christ. And as we follow in the footsteps of Christ we are to take up something...take up a cause...take up a ministry... live as Christ wants us to live.


