

Pastors Ponderings March 2023

The season of Lent has begun. The theme for this year's Lenten services focuses on transformation. We will be on a Journey of Transformation looking first at the story of Jesus' Journey in the Wilderness (Matthew 4:1-11).

Then, we will spend four Sundays with wonderful stories from the Gospel of John. The first story, on March 5 (the Second Sunday in Lent), is about the encounter of Jesus and Nicodemus as told in John 3:1-17. On March 12 (the Third Sunday in Lent) we learn about the encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan Woman at the Well found in John 4:5-42. On the Fourth Sunday in Lent (March 19) we hear the story of the Man Born Blind from John 9:1-41 and then on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we hear the final story from John 11:1-45 (March 26) where we learn about and encounter between Jesus and Lazarus and his sisters Mary and Martha. The story on Palm/Passion Sunday (April 2) comes from Matthew 26 and 27 about Jesus' final entry into Jerusalem.

Consider the opportunity of reading those mains texts before the designated Sundays in Lent

Church Board Highlights from February 20, 2023

The minutes from January 23, 2023 and the treasurer's report were reviewed. The minutes and the treasurer's report were accepted. It was moved and seconded that the board move \$30,000 from the endowment fund to the operating fund. The motion passed.

Head usher duties were discussed and reviewed.

Pastors' Report: Pastor Dennis stated that the Governance and Structure Team has met one time and have another scheduled meeting on March 5th. He also said that Pastor Linda and he continue to work with schedules to hold confirmation classes for four of our young people. The board offered appreciation for their efforts.

Committee Meeting Highlights

Music & Worship - Ash Wednesday service was to be held on Wednesday, February 22 at 7:00 pm.

Christian Education - The Annual Easter Egg Hunt will be held on Saturday, April 8th at St. John's.

Outreach and Benevolence - Requested the following contributions be made: OCWM - \$1000, CUE - \$1000, Merom - \$1000, BABE - \$500, LAM - \$500; Phoebe's Mission - \$500, and Laundry Love - \$500 for a total of \$5000. The board approved.

Technology - Two of the outdoor cameras broke and were replaced using house expense funds in the amount of \$490.00.

Search Committee - Received two more profiles. They will be interviewing both candidates.

Unfinished Business - The congregational meeting will be held on March 5 immediately following worship service. Please encourage fellow members to attend to vote for a needed quorum change and for affirming new board members.

New Business - The board approved use of the kitchen and Memorial Hall for April 26, 2023 from 4:00 to 7:00 pm by Good Samaritan. This is for a community meal distribution.

Complete Church Board minutes and treasurer's report are available after approval at the next month's board meeting.

The next meeting is March 20, 2023 @ 7:00 pm.

Annual Congregational Meeting

Dear Church Family Member,

As you may be aware, we were not able to hold our Annual Congregational Meeting as scheduled in January since we did not have a quorum present. The Board has scheduled a Congregational Meeting for March 5 immediately following worship in the hope that we can complete the business of the Church. A quorum requires 45 active members present. In addition to the regular committee reports and budget approval, we have 2 important items that will need your vote. First, we will be voting on the new members of the Church Board so they can officially be installed. Second, the Board has proposed the following change to the St. John's UCC Constitution, reducing a quorum from 25% to 15%:

"Article VII: Governance

B. A quorum to do business at such a Church meeting shall consist of twenty-five fifteen percent (25 15) of the active members of the Congregation."

To change the Constitution requires a 2/3 majority of voting members present.

Your input and vote on these items are essential. The Congregation makes all important decisions in the life of our Church, so I am asking that you make every effort to attend worship and the Congregational Meeting on March 5. Every voice is important. Please contact me or any member of the Board if you have questions or concerns. sincerely,

On June 30, 2023, the United Church of Christ will gather in downtown Indianapolis for worship, fellowship, and the business of the wider church. Delegates and visitors will converge at the Convention Center from across the nation and from around the world. Each Conference of the United

Church of Christ will send delegates for the purpose of passing resolutions and electing a new President and General Minister to lead the United Church of Christ.

Delegates, visitors, and staff persons will gather for worship, and a variety of fellowship activities, including a concert with Carrie Newcomer.

More than 300 Indiana-Kentucky Conference volunteers are needed to greet and assist the more than 3000 delegates and visitors. The Local Arrangements Committee is in the process of raising \$70,00 to support the activities they are responsible for including the Newcomer concert which will be held at the White River Park Pavilion
