

The Theme for General Synod 34 is "Making All Things New". The dates are June 30-July 4. The place will be the Indianapolis Convention Center. More than 3000 members of the United Church of Christ, from around the world, will converge in Indianapolis for worship, fellowship, workshops, business, and elections. There will be keynote speakers, excellent preachers, and a new President and General Minister of the United Church of Christ.

There will be a Community Worship service on Sunday at 2:30 pm followed by the Indiana-Kentucky Conference-sponsor Festival of Friends featuring Carrie Newcomer and The McLain Family Band at White River State Park, Celebration Plaza Amphitheater. Both events are open to the public and registration is not required. Closing Worship will be on Tuesday at 7:30 pm. After worship, you could hang around to experience the Indianapolis 4th of July fireworks display.

Volunteers are still needed to welcome and assist the many UCC guests who will be gathering at the Convention Center and many of the downtown hotels. *Volunteers are eligible for a discounted registration fee of \$65 for all of Synod*. If you would like to volunteer go to ikcucc.org, decide when you can serve, and fill out the form. Volunteers will receive a special code to use on the General Synod Registration form, which is available on the website, ucc.org.

The Church Board has authorized a special offering to support the budget of the Indiana-Kentucky Conference Local Arrangements Committee. Please place your gifts in the offering plate on Sundays or bring/mail your gift to the Church Office. Your Interim Ministers will be at General Synod as volunteers. Hope to see you at General Synod.

General Synod 34

On June 30, 2023, the United Church of Christ will gather in downtown Indianapolis for worship, fellowship, and the business of the wider church. Delegates and visitors will converge at the Convention Center from across the nation and from around the world. Each Conference of the United Church of Christ will send delegates for the purpose of passing resolutions and electing a new President and General Minister to lead the United Church of Christ.

Delegates, visitors, and staff persons will gather for worship, and a variety of fellowship activities, including a concert with Carrie Newcomer.

More than 300 Indiana-Kentucky Conference volunteers are needed to greet and assist the more than 3000 delegates and visitors. The Local Arrangements Committee is in the process of raising \$70,00 to support the activities they are responsible for including the Newcomer concert which will be held at the White River Park Pavilion.

A list of volunteer positions that need to be filled is posted on the bulletin board outside the Church Office in addition to information on how to volunteer.

Robin Dennis Root, 89, of Fritchton, IN went to be with the Lord May 13, 2023. He was born on December 30,1933, on the Root Farm, in his current home, in Fritchton. He was the eldest son of Floyd and Sylva (Dennis) Root. He attended and graduated from Fritchton High School, where he proudly played basketball as a Fritchton Eagle. Robin married, the love of his life, Joan Pieper of Freelandville, IN on August 1, 1954. They were an inseparable team for 48 years. A lifelong farmer and active community leader, Robin was passionate about giving back to his church and community. Robin, a devoted Christian, became a member of the St. John's United Church of Christ in 1957. He proudly served on the St. John's UCC board and took an active part in the youth-related ministries. Robin was on the Knox County Farm Bureau Board, formerly serving as both President and Vice-President. He was a member of the South Knox School Board, coached South Knox Jr. High basketball, and was president of the SK Sport Boosters. He also served many years on the Knox County Co-op Board. Most remember Robin and Joan as Knox Co. Rural Youth Advisors, making hundreds of gallons of ice cream at the Knox Co. fair. Robin was passionate about basketball, likely the record holder for actively playing A-League Basketball at the YMCA well past his 65th birthday. Robin has an uncanny way of remembering games played and the outcomes from years passed, which amazed his grandchildren and any others who would listen. 
Wedding Shower Announcement
