Church Board Highlights June 19, 2023

The May minutes and Treasurer's report were reviewed and approved.

Prayers for healing for Betsy Klein's arm. Also, prayers for Mitch Cooper who has been deployed.

Committee Report Highlights

Christian Education. The youth mission week was a success. A trip to Holiday World is planned for July 6. Vacation Bible School will begin in August and the theme of spiritual gifts will be used. They plan to use members to share their knowledge and talents with the kids during the Sunday School hour. The children's message will be related to the theme as well as Children's Church time. Discussing ways to stay in contact with recent high school graduates.

Pre-School Committee. The committee meets as necessary and they recently met on June 14, 2023. The members of the committee are Allison Cummins, Jordan Daniels, Brenda Roark, Jill Lopez, Miss Lori, and Miss April. A Preschool assistant is needed. Five children, their families, mentors, and prayer partners participated. The requested benevolent recommendation of a total of \$6,000 was approved.

Congregational Life. About 50+ people attended the Church picnic and had a great time. Thanks to everyone for bringing food and helping.

Technology. There had been some issues with the website and Brian Fillingim worked with the company to get the matter resolved, at a bargain to us! A training course will be created for guidance for online for the use of the computers at church.

Memorial. Permission was given to the Higher Bound program to use the church facilities for its' 25th-anniversary celebration in April 2024.

The St. John's Children and Family Ministry had a very busy second week of June. The group of 28 kids helped different nonprofits/ outreach programs in Knox County throughout the week. Thank you to all the youth, parents and chaperones for making this week great. Every place we helped the staff were so happy with the youth that they asked when we could come back! During the week the group made memories as they helped their community.

Monday, June 5 (St. John's Day)- For the first day the group worked on some of the outreach programs that the church provides of Sandy's Pantry/Phoebe's Mission/Blessing Box. The group also helped the preschool by painting the playground.

<u>Tuesday, June 6 (Isaiah House/Salvation Army)</u>- On this day the group worked at the Isaiah House the group put new mulch down, planted flowers, and watered all the landscape plants. Inside the house, the youth organized/counted donated items and cleaned the house. After lunch at Gregg Park and group moved on to the Salvation Army. At Salvation Army, the youth made food boxes and helped people to their cars with the boxes. Also, the group unloaded a food trailer and stocked the shelves.
