

Rally Day - Wordnik.com offers a description of "rally" as " a renewal of energy in joint action." Often, the Sunday

"It's also a time to remind people of all ages they can do something grand with another or for another generation. People at all ages and stages of life have value and something valuable to contribute to making our world a better place."

A few survey statistic results from 2022-2023 are inspiring to the integrity of our 22 years of service with Riley School.

- * Top 5 States with KIDS HOPE USA Programs : Michigan, Texas, Indiana, Illinois, and Ohio.
- *99% of Mentors found their time valuable with their student.
- * 10,690 lives impacted through KIDS HOPE USA program in 2022-2023 school year.
- * 87% of mentors said they feel more connected to their church because of mentoring.
- *90% of mentors were encouraged about their relationship with their students
- *Key areas mentors saw as the biggest impact on their students are; Social Emotional Skills, Confidence and Attitude.
- * Top Activities during Mentoring were Games, Conversation, Creative activities and Reading.

Every child at Riley wants a mentor (SMILE, they love us!)and mentors are needed.

The program is presently open to new mentors. We invite anyone who may love children, have 1/2 hour a week to give through Kids Hope USA, please contact us for more information. Jean Jackson Wells, 92, of Vincennes, passed away August 10, 2023 at Good Samaritan Hospital in Vincennes. She was born March 6, 1931 in Carlisle, IN. She will be remembered as an Early Childhood Educator of the North Gibson Schools. She graduated from Fritchton High School in 1948, Indiana University in 1952, and taught Kindergarten in Indianapolis Public Schools. She received her Masters degree from the University of Evansville in 1979. In College,

she was a member of Pi Lambda Theta Honor Society and Alpha Gamma Delta Social Fraternity. Jean moved to Vincennes in 1987, and joined Daughters of the American Revolution.
