The February Church Board minutes and Treasurer's report were reviewed and approved.

Pastor's Report. Pastor Debbie Jo has been busy visiting with shutins, visiting Willow Manor and Colonial Assisted Living, and attending committee meetings. We will have an adult baptism on Palm Sunday, and she is sending letters to potential members about joining the church on April 7th. Pastor Debbie's letter of transfer has been received. Scarlett is now fully certified as a therapy dog, and they visited with the Preschool 4 year old class and the morning 3 year old class where Pastor Debbie Jo read a story. Her goal is to do this on a monthly basis and reaching out to PACE across the street to see if they would also like a visit. On April 5th we are having a family movie night at 6:30 in Memorial Hall to enjoy pizza and watch *Little Shop of Horrors*.

Committee Report Highlights

Music & Worship. Maundy Thursday service with communion will be March 28th at noon in the chapel, and Good Friday Tenebrae service will be at 7:00 p.m.

Christian Education. The children will participate in the Palm Sunday Service. They will come down the center aisle waiving palm branches during the opening hymn.

St. John's History Tidbit...

The Golden Years

We are now up to 1948 when the interior of the church was completely redecorated, the chancel changed to make the sanctuary an altercentered church, new carpeting, wood paneling and other renovations. The centennial year was celebrated in 1949.

In 1957, a union was consummated between the Evangelical and Reformed Church and the Congregational Christian Church and our present church took the name of St. John's United Church of Christ.

Also in 1957, another building project was undertaken with a new foyer and chapel connecting the Church with Memorial Hall. The chapel was named Ritterskamp Chapel.

In 1959, the third parsonage was built and housed many of our pastors and their families.

In 1963 and 1971, the houses behind the parsonage and the Church were purchased and razed. A parking lot was built on these lots the entire length between Hart and Shelby Streets.

In 1971, the Church's interior was redecorated and new carpeting was installed. In 1974, new pews were installed in the Church for our 125th Anniversary, and in 1977, the stained glass windows were covered with Tuflax to protect them from being vandalized. Ramps were installed, Sunday School rooms were redecorated, and hearing aid equipment was installed throughout the Church. By the end of 1979, St. John's was blessed with over 450 members.
