#### A Note From Our Pastor

Dear Friends:

I was thrilled to have twenty-three people attend our first round-table discussion on July 15th in Memorial Hall. First, I presented some of my observations from my first five months as your Pastor, followed by some tasks we need to address. I shared these four observations:

- 1. This is a loving, committed congregation, very mission minded.
  - 2. I believe you are starved for pastoral care
- 3. The congregation has been in survival mode for the past several years, especially during Covid, the lengthy interim period, and the search for a Pastor.
- 4. Triangulation is a big issue with communication. This was followed by some tasks we needed to address.
- 1. Like all churches, ours has rising expenses and diminishing revenue, so we must take stewardship very seriously.
- 2.We have to adapt or die. Change is never easy. If we keep doing things the way we've always done, we can't expect new results. Due to the average age of the congregation and the pastor, we don't have years to work on trust and slowly lay foundations. We have to act as swiftly as we can but not recklessly. Some things we're just going to have to take on faith.
- 3.We need to find more people with online skills to help increase our online presence.
- 4. All boards and committees need to be on a rotational basis. To help us move from survival mode, we have to move from the "we need someone, anyone to fill the spots available" to an active, healthy nominating committee that reflects on the skills needed and, identifies persons with those skill sets, and recruits them to serve. We need to continually get more people working on behalf of the church's ministries.
- 5. Need to better understand generational differences. This included an informational handout and discussion of the six generations within the congregation. We then reviewed some steps the Board and Committees are taking to help us move forward:

- 1. The Board is studying the book "Canoeing the Mountains" by Tod Bolsinger to help understand how our culture has shifted and how we need to respond.
- 2. We are developing programs in response to the congregational survey results. (These were shared in last month's newsletter.)
- 3. We are beginning the process of becoming a WISE congregation (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supporting, and Engaged). We are looking for at least two more volunteers to help us through this process.
- 4. Pray-Ground for children. Visitors need to know immediately that we are a safe place that welcomes children and young families. Children need to know they are welcomed and cherished, and church is fun!
- 5. Initiating a Messy Church (a church within a church). We have 6 members willing to serve on the core team and welcome any others who are interested. We hope to launch this outreach program in October or November.
- 6. Working to improve communication throughout the congregation. Some thoughts to remember: Only make "I" statements (I think, I believe, I feel, etc. Do not use generalized statements like "Well, I know others think the way I do" or "A bunch of us don't like. . ." Speak for yourself alone and speak DIRECTLY to the person who needs to hear what you have to say. Do not draw someone else into the process, thereby creating a triangle. Do not speak for someone else unless you have permission to mention them by name. Encourage them to speak for themselves.

We then opened the discussion to hear what everyone present wished to share with the following results:

More details and information regarding the W.I.S.E. program and Messy Church. The importance of connection and building relationships with the community. The threads that tie us together and how we weave them into a tapestry of God's love.

Possible billboard advertising the church and that all are welcome. Bumper stickers. These items may hit older generations rather than younger ones. We need to increase our online presence.

We need to update our vision and mission statements. A mission statement should be eight words or less and appear on everything we

send out as a church. Possibly, everyone should say it together in worship each week.

How can younger people who have missed the opportunity to take part in Confirmation unite with the church? How can they know they are welcome to partake in communion? In the communion invitation it says, "all are welcome to participate." The pastor will write an article for the bulletin (and put it on slide) and newsletter regarding communion practices.

List Board Members and Committee Chairs in the Bulletin & Newsletter with their contact information.

We need a new pictorial directory. This project was organized and about to move forward when COVID-19 hit. Pictures could possibly be used to create a wall display so people can learn names and faces. How can we better improve communication between the committees? Perhaps all committee chairs could meet quarterly or include chairs in the packet of reports the Board receives each month. Committees need clearer "duty lists."

Could we develop a plan when all committees meet at the same time and then gather to share information with everyone? The idea of "Wonderful Wednesdays" was suggested with meal and committee meetings.

Written reports to the Board need more details, and each committee should submit monthly written reports.

Vanco has communication training/resources we can utilize. Bible Studies could be led by laypeople, not necessarily by the Pastor.

We are so appreciative to everyone who came and shared their thoughts and concerns. We are hoping to have these discussions periodically throughout the year so we can better communicate and work together to grow our church.

I want to encourage each and every one of you to help by praying regularly for our congregation, our spiritual growth, our discernment of God's will, and our courage to make necessary changes as we live out our faith and commitment to our loving and generous God.

## Church Board Highlights July 2024



<u>BOARD MEETING</u> The June minutes, Treasurer's report and Pastor's report were reviewed and approved.

Joys & Concerns – Prayers for Kelly Alexander's mother who is currently in the hospital; prayers for the family of Bob Maze that recently passed away. The children's handbell choir did a wonderful job as the special music!

#### **Committee Report Highlights**

**Music and Worship.** The Board unanimously approved the purchase of a Yamaha CVP905B Clavinova for the sanctuary from undesignated funds from the Memorial committee. A digital piano is also being purchased for the chapel by private gift. The company will remove the pianos (one of the pianos will be going to the music department at Vincennes University).

Church Facilities/Improvements. The Board unanimously voted to pay from the Building account fund the remaining cleanup (remove all remaining debris and bird droppings) of the Bell Tower. In a second and separate project for the Bell Tower, the Board unanimously voted for placement of guards over the screens in the Bell Tower to prevent birds from getting in. This would also come from the Building fund.

**Wilhelm Parsonage.** The parsonage is in need of a new roof and we have received several estimates for replacement cost. A committee will review the estimates and bring their recommendation to the Church Board for discussion. The replacement of the roof will necessitate a congregational meeting to approve the expenditure.

Complete Church Board minutes and Treasurer's report are available after approval at the next month's board meeting.

The next Church Board meeting will be August 19, 2024.

#### 2024 Children and Family Ministry In-Town Mission Activity

The St. John's Children and Family Ministry had a very busy second week of July. The group of a total of 26 kids during the week helped different nonprofits/outreach programs in Knox County. Thank you to all the youth, parents, and chaperones for making this week great. Thank you to everyone who donated supplies for the week, too! Every place we helped, the staff were so happy with the youth that they asked when we could come back! During the week the group made memories as they helped their community.

Monday, July 8 (St. John's Day)- For the first day the group worked on some of the outreach programs that the church provides. The group moved some shelves in Phoebe's room, stocked the shelves of Phoebe's, counted donated supplies for Phoebe's, and counted/checked expired items for Sandy's. Also, during the day, the group moved a bookcase into the office, worked on the playground, made care kits, spot-painted the big blue room, and moved the carpet out of the preschool.

<u>Tuesday, July 9 (Blue Jeans Center)</u>- On this day the group helped at the Blue Jeans Center in Monroe City. Since the center is staffed by volunteers and it was a rainy day, the youth helped with the housekeeping of the facilities. The youth cleaned the windows of the cafeteria and the first floor of the main building. They cleaned the gym floor by cleaning up the shoe marks and sweeping under the bleachers. The group wiped all the woodwork in the main hall and moved furniture in the basement. The list of day two tasks is too long to list all the projects. This was a big help to the center since the staff is based on volunteers, and it would have taken weeks to do.

<u>Wednesday, July 10 (Wabash Trails/Salvation Army)</u>- In the morning the group gave back to their home base for the week. At Wabash Trails, the group picked up trash along the road and some of the trails at the park. Also, at the park, the group worked in the camping area, maintaining landscapes and RV sites. In the afternoon at Salvation Army, the youth stocked shelves in the food pantry cleaned the donation closets, worked in a couple of meeting rooms, and did some housekeeping jobs.

Thursday, July 11 (Isaiah House/Rainbow Beach/Family Dinner)- For Thursday's mission day the group helped at the Isaiah House. Some of the help the youth did was to clean the outside wall paneling, pull weeds, and sweep the sidewalks. Also, outside the group cleaned the fence and cleaned the outside toys. Inside the house the group cleaned the floors and the kids' rooms. Upstairs the youth worked on totes of donated supplies. After the Isaiah House the group traveled to Gregg Park for lunch and then Rainbow Beach. For dinner, the youth made an Italian dinner for their family.

Friday, July 12 (Animal Shelter/Finishing Up)-The final day of the mission week started with the group preparing for the Isaiah House lemonade stand. After preparing for the stand, the youth traveled to the animal shelter. The group donated supplies to the shelter and had an opportunity to visit the animals at the pet port. While visiting the shelter, the children went to the cat room and saw the dogs in the outdoor kennels. Many people have been and will be impacted by all the work the group did during that week. Thanks to all youth and parents for everything during the mission week.
