Church Board Highlights August 19, 2024

The July minutes and Treasurer's report were reviewed and approved.

Committee Meeting Highlights

Approved end-of-school-year bonuses for preschool director and assistant.

Approved recommended expenditures for the Outreach and Benevolence Committee as follows: OCWM - \$1,000, CUE - \$500, Food Pantry - \$1,000, Friends Who Care and Count - \$500, LAM - \$500, Phoebe's - \$1,000, Riley Lu Lichte Fund - \$500, Messy Church - \$500, for a total of \$5,500.

Approved the expenditure of \$7,600 for the repair of the church parking lot.

The parsonage needs a new roof. A committee was formed to seek bids for the roof replacement. They secured several bids and recommended to the Church Board to accept Ellconn, LLC's bid of \$21,904. Due to the amount of the bid, a special congregational meeting will be held on September 22, 2024, to discuss and approve this bid.

New Business

Due to the resignation of our janitorial service, we are in the process of obtaining bids for it. Three services have reviewed our church and the services we require and will soon submit bids.

Complete Church Board minutes and Treasurer's report, which are available after approval at next month's board meeting.

The next meeting will be September 16, 2024.

We hope you enjoyed the many events this year and look forward to what St. John's will be up to in the future!




