

Church Board Highlights November 18, 2024

BOARD MEETING Joys and Concerns: The chili cook-off dinner was a fun time. It was nice to have the pledge commitment cards blessed. Krisi Mattingly and Larry Marchino both did a great job on their stewardship comments. Jana did a great job on the pledge letter that was sent out to members. Congratulations to Steve on his newest granddaughter, Jillian Claire!

The amended agenda and secretary's report (after corrections and clarifications) were accepted.

Discussing the financial reports, Ed explained that the Wilhelm 2 fund should have approximately \$24,273 less (parsonage roof and revised parsonage utilities) and the Scholarship fund would also be \$10,360 less after reimbursing the general fund for 175th anniversary expenses. The Treasurer's report was accepted.

Pastor Debbie Jo's report was included the following highlights:

Confirmation class has begun with seven confirmands. Confirmation will take place on May 4, 2025.

Fifteen people participated in the recent Bible study and a new Bible study will begin in January on the Gnostic Gospels.

Pleased with the initial Messy Church event. We had 14 participants and 12 volunteers and received lots of good feedback from those attended. The next Messy Church will be December 4th.

Advent begins December 1st. The Christmas Eve service will be at 7:00 p.m. with Jonathan Clark providing special music.
