ADULT BIBLE STUDY on The Gnostic Gospels will be held at 10:30 am and 6:30 pm on Tuesdays, January 21, 28, and February 4, 11. The Gnostic Gospels are 52 texts discovered in 1945 in Nag Hammadi, Egypt. They include 'secret' gospels, poems, and myths attributing to Jesus' sayings and beliefs, which are very different from the New Testament. We will be focusing on the Gospel of Thomas, the Gospel of Phillip, and the Gospel of Mary Magdalene. We will also look at the Gospel of Judas if we have time. If more time is needed, we will add more sessions. Pastor Debbie will have some background info on these gospels to prepare for this study; copies of it are available in the church office.

We recognize that any change can be difficult. However, many churches have done this for years. We believe that, eventually, most of our members and church friends will appreciate the convenience of this. We may use this email to provide other information to our church family.

Lastly while this change may not be seamless and you certainly will need to update the church office on your current email address, we believe that this is an important step for our church family to take to address our cash flow problem. We have other ideas which will be shared at the congregation meeting in January. It is important that each of us play a role in working toward a more balanced budget. This is a small step but gives us each a chance to benefit St. Johns by working to make this change successful.

Church Board Highlights December 16, 2024

Joys and Concerns: The children's Christmas program was wonderful. Everyone did a great job and enjoyed watching the children and the confirmands involved. The Schotter family did a great job with the Advent wreath lighting! Thanks to Will Meyer for the church's Christmas display at Gregg Park. Prayers for all involved in the school shooting in Wisconsin. The amended agenda and secretary's report were accepted after adding the Pre-School to new business.

Ed discussed the financial reports and motioned that he be allowed to make some fund transfers to reimburse the operating fund for monies expended from the operating fund that should come out of specific funds. The motion was unanimously passed.

Pastor Debbie Jo's report included the following highlights:

Confirmands and their families will be lighting the Advent candles each week. In January, we will begin a new weekday/evening Adult Bible Study on the Gnostic Gospels, focusing on the Gospel of Thomas and the Gospel of Mary Magdalene. Messy Church's January theme is There's Snow Body Like You. Due to the first Wednesday being New Year's Day, Messy Church will be held on January 8th.

Scarlett and Pastor Debbie Jo read The Legend of the Candy Cane to the Caterpillar classes on December 3rd.

Christmas Eve service will take place at 7:00 pm, and Jonathan Clark will provide special music.

On January 5th, we will celebrate Epiphany, and the 1st Sunday in January is Baptism of Jesus Sunday, during which everyone will have the opportunity to renew their baptism vows.

Pastor Debbie Jo will be traveling during the week between Christmas and New Years to visit with family and friends.

She will be away from the pulpit on December 29th which will be a service of Lessons and Carols and will not require a guest minister.

Music & Worship

January 12th everyone is invited to help with taking down the holiday decorations. Annual congregation meeting is January 19th.

Christian Education

The youth fundraiser of selling cookies, etc., for Christmas is going well.

Pre-sale of soups is available through January 17th, with pick up being on January 19th following the annual congregational meeting. There will be soup available on that date also for purchase. Youth Group meeting will be January 5th at 6:00 following confirmation class.

Pre-School

We were informed via a letter sent to preschool parents that Miss April Brown will not return as St. John's preschool director/teacher in August of 2025. St. John's is committed to the uninterrupted continuation of the preschool, and the preschool committee will be meeting in January to develop a job description for the position and discuss how to move forward.

Finance

A tentative budget report for the Operating Fund was presented for review and acceptance.

The Board voted to change the monthly newsletter that is currently being mailed to be sent electronically to members. Watch the bulletins for more details. Anyone that would prefer to have a paper newsletter may contact the church office.

Finance Committee Report for 2024

2024 was a great year for St. John's UCC. Pastor Debbie Jo Atkins became our settled pastor in February and brought joy and new ideas, as did Scarlett, to our congregation. Thanks to the great work of Sheri Stodghill and her extraordinary committee, we celebrated our 175th Anniversary in grand style. We also made and continue to make improvements to our church facilities, principally thanks to Mark Schutz, Marvin, and Sandee Covey. We welcomed new and old friends to our church.

All of these projects and changes, though necessary and beneficial to our church, cost money. We have reserves mostly invested in the stock market, which has been done well. However, the market doesn't always go up. This year we made transfers from those reserves of over \$170,000 to maintain a positive balance in our Operating Account. At the beginning of the year, \$62,100 of that money came from the Gauer distribution. The remainder came from the close out of our Regions money market account and our Wilhelm and Scholarship accounts at Edward Jones. We changed the Wilhelm account from an investment account with investment costs to a money market account so we could more easily access those funds to pay for operational expenses.

We hope that 2025 is the year we start to turn the corner on getting our receipts closer to or in balance with our expenditures. We have a good start. The pledge campaign received commitments of \$130,056 for the Operating Fund - an increase of over \$25,000 from 2024. This is due to the spirit and experience of Pastor Debbie Jo but also the outstanding lay speakers Larry Marchino and Krisi Mattingly as well as Jana Vieck's superb President's letter to the congregation. Of course, the real credit goes to those who pledged, particularly those who increased their pledge.

We know, however, that we need to review expenses and consider ways to maximize the use of our resources. The preschool now pays its cleaning costs directly from its budget. Its reimbursement to the church for cleaning, insurance, utilities, and related expenses has not been changed since 2016.

We are also changing to emailing our newsletter to save significant time and around \$3,800 on a yearly basis. Other possibilities will be discussed at the Congregational meeting. Our budget for this year could come close to balancing if we don't have large unanticipated expenses. We recognize that we will have some; we just hope they are not too large.

We hope that addressing the budget issues will bring us together to address a problem that has been lingering for a number of years. Our commitment to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and our attempts to do his work here are too important for us not to take steps to see that our Church's long-term future is secured.
